Below you will find the students requirements and options for volunteering.

- Completion of 20 hours of community service May 1- First day of School
- Community Service will be allowed to roll into the requirements to graduate with honors

 Completion annually can provide the student with 60 hours
- 5 can be Job Shadowing (but will not be calculated towards Graduating with honors)
- Student can always exceed 20 hours (still in need to obtain 140 hours)
- First day of school will require:
 - Submission of hours (see following pages for forms)
 - Pictures of an outstanding moment
 - \circ $\;$ Brief description of the activity and what the student took from it
- Within the First week the student will complete a presentation to their peers
- Completion of the Student's 9th Grade year: Can be non-medical due to age and access
 - Mission Trips/ 5K volunteer/cooking a meal for elderly/cutting grass/ Tutoring
 - Event or Fundraiser organizer for a medical purpose/ Summer MSA Preparedness
 - Volunteer for an organization that is doing community awareness projects

Completion of the Student's 10th Grade Year and 11th Grade years Medical Base encouraged

- Medical Mission Trips/ Nursing Homes/ Hospice/ Local Hospitals/Blood Donation
- Health Fairs/ Fundraising Event for a medical necessity/
